From the desk of Faith Dorothy Dodge Nelson November/December 2008

Growing up in the household of Earl F. Dodge, a man who was six times a third-party candidate for President of the United States, I naturally developed an interest in politics. Election nights became a party of sorts as we indulged in popcorn and root beer while watching the returns roll in. I've carried on the tradition of political interest in my own family; in fact, this year I served for the first time as a poll worker, an experience which filled me with civic pride.

As my father's daughter, I have lived through many disappointing elections and should now be able to take a loss in stride. If I confess, however, that I was in a foul mood the day after the polls closed, you will know who I voted for. My generally good nature was replaced with a black mood, I'm ashamed to admit. Fortunately, my family put up with me. Encouraged by my husband, Joe, Jesse (our son who is away at college) phoned me to cheer me with the announcement that he would be home for Thanksgiving.

After the crisis of the stock market, the government bailout, and a disappointing election result (for me, at any rate), I'm glad to have Thanksgiving to look forward to. I love the historic roots of the holiday, as well as the inherent meaning. Perhaps because my ancestor William Dodge came to America in 1629, only nine years after the Pilgrims, I feel a connection to those brave souls. They left all that was familiar for the possibility of better life and religious freedom. Expressing gratitude to God for his blessings instead of bemoaning the hardships they suffered serves as an inspiration to those who would wallow in self-pity.
