

North Gate on Miramar Road

Gate is between Camino Ruiz and Kearny Villa Road. Once on base, continue straight through the stop sign at Delta, and turn right at the first stop light onto Hercules Road. Continue to the end of the street and right onto Rigel Road. The Officer's Club is the last building on the left.

Main Gate Entrance from I-15

Exit Miramar Way, proceed west on Miramar Way to the gate, continue on Miramar Way thought one stop light and two four way stop intersections, turn right onto Rigel Road, follow approximately 3/4 mile. The Officer's Club is the last building on the left.
