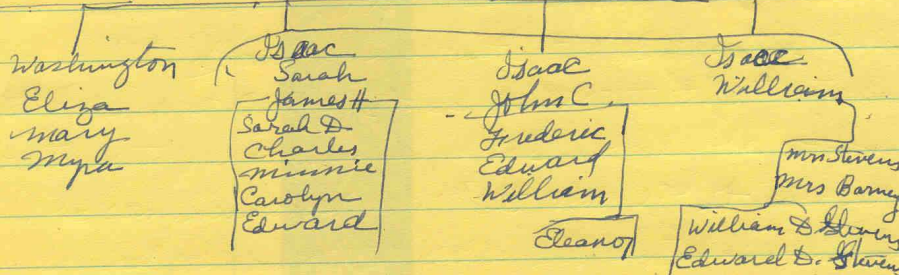

Dodge Paul, Ipswich Sergeant Capt. Elisha Whitney's Co of minute men, which marched on the alarm of Apr 19, 1775, from Ipswich Hamlet to Mystic: returned Apr 22, 1775. Also marched from Ipswich Hamlet to Cambridge May 1, 1775. Services 16 days. also Ensign Capt Richard Dodge's Co, Col Gerrish's regt; return dated Camp at Chelsea July 28 1775; also 2nd Lt, Capt Richard Dodge's (3) Co, Lt Col Loamnie Baldwin's (late Heintz's) 38th regt. Muster roll dated Aug 1, 1775; engaged Apr 30, 1775; services 11 weeks & 4 days; also company return dated Chelsea Sept 1, 1775; also company return dated Oct 2, 1775; also letter from Gen. W. Heath to Col Loamnie Baldwin at Chelsea, dated Camp at Cambridge Dec 17, 1775 stating that certain appointments previously asked for would be confirmed said Dodge to be commissioned as 1st Lt also 2nd Lt account of rations allowed officers of Col Baldwin's regt between July 1 1775 & Dec 31, 1775 dated Chelsea also receipt dated Trenton Jan 1st 1776, signed by said Dodge for bounty for men in Col Baldwin's regt, who agreed to serve 6 weeks from the last of Dec 1775; also, 1st Lt, Col Baldwin's 26th regt; return of officers dated Cambridge Jan 8, 1776 also pay abstracts for Jan to Mar 1776, also receipt dated March N.Y. Apr 3, 1776 for ration allowance from Jan 1, 1776 - Apr 1, 1776; also pay abstracts for April - June 1776; also list of men returned as having lost articles at the evacuation of N.Y. Sept 14, 1776; also, Company returns date Newtown Dec 12, 1776; and

mixfield Dec. 28, 1776; also return of officers in Col Baldwin's  
 regt who marched on expedition to Trenton Dec 26,  
 1776; dated Mixfield Penn. Dec 29 1776. also, return  
 of men who tarried 6 weeks from Dec 31, 1776,  
 Dodge Paul, Captain 1st Co Col Jones (3rd Lincoln Co)  
 regt of Mass. militia list of officers commissioned  
 May 23, 1780.

by Joseph Thompson Dodge Ph.D. Madison Wisconsin is found the  
following:

In March 1770 he [Paul father of Col Paul Dodge] sold to his son,  
Paul for 73 l 6 s & d 14 acres & the west end of his house  
with  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre on which house stood. His widow Faith was living  
with her son Paul in Newcastle Me. 1784 (Essex deeds v 158-114)  
The families of Paul & his brother Richard are of more than  
usual interest, not only for their mental & physical energy  
but for the many descendants who have deserved and  
attained considerable distinction.

at Newcastle Maine Sept 13, 1828 age 82 yrs.

In Mass Historical Soc Proceedings Vol 15 Pg 86. - Among  
officers commissioned May 17, 1775 by the Mass Congress  
in the regiment in which Samuel Gerrish was Colonel, one  
company <sup>was</sup> Richard Dodge, Capt; Robert Dodge 1<sup>st</sup> Lt & Paul Dodge 2<sup>nd</sup> Lt  
Richard, Robert, & Paul were brothers in law. Further evidence of his  
military service will probably come to light when the Mass archives  
are published. He purchased a large tract of land in Newcastle,  
which is still occupied by his descendants (1848) The farm was divided  
between his sons, David, Isaac & Washington.

Washington<sup>6</sup> (Paul<sup>5</sup> Paul<sup>4</sup> Richard<sup>3</sup> Richard<sup>2</sup> Richard<sup>1</sup>) b Mar 6, 1778 in New Castle, Me. where he lived till his death Sept 29, 1855. He was a farmer & Cooper & for many years an honored deacon of the Congregational Church. He married Dec 13 1802 Nancy Perkins b at Newcastle Mar 6, 1783, d May 9 1867. She was a daughter of Oliver Perkins a farmer of New Castle. Their children all settled in that part of Maine, except Mrs Joshua (Caroline) Blinn who died in Cal. in 1858. All were comfortably situated & looked upon as among the best people. Children all born at New Castle.

He was the son of Benj & Margaret (Dodge) Dodge of Edgecomb. Benj was a farmer & brick manufacturer & merchant & at the time of his death was Post Master at E. Newcastle Me. He owned that part of Col Dodge's farm which was given to his son Isaac, & which was bought from his heirs a few years since so that it is now held by a direct descendant of Col Paul Dodge who by marriage recovered the Dodge name.
